There are different questions for each Bible study method. Write down insights as they come; the ultimate goal is application, not just interpretation. Make up your mind that you will regularly put some time into the study of the Bible. Below are several Bible study methods, followed by a description of widely available research tools. Topical Bible Study: According to R. A. Torrey in How to Study the Bible for Greatest Profit, Bible students should take up various subjects, one by one, and search the Bible for what it has to say on these subjects. Collect and compare all the verses you can find on a particular topic. Select a biblical subject and trace it through a single book. Compile a list of words, collect Bible references, consider each one, and compare and group the references. Organize your conclusions into an outline that you can share with another person. It may be important to know what God has to say on these subjects; but it is far more important to know what great men and women have to say on these subjects. The topical method of Bible study is simplest, most fascinating, and yields the greatest immediate results. Sometimes it will be necessary to look up other subjects that are closely related to the one in question. For example, if you wish to study what the teaching of God's Word is regarding the Atonement, you will not only look under the heading "Atonement" but also under the heading "Blood." The Chapter Summary Method: According to Warren, the student should read a chapter of a Bible book at least five times, and then write down a summary of the central thoughts as well as the major points in the chapter. Make a list of the most important people. Why are they included? Choose a verse which summarizes the whole chapter or one which speaks to you personally. List any difficulties you may have with the chapter. Look for other verses that help clarify what the chapter is talking about. What are the major principles, insights, and lessons? Why does God want this passage in the Bible? Ask yourself a series of questions relating to the chapter into its natural sections and find headings for them that describe their contents. Write down the leading facts of the chapter in their proper order. Make note of the persons mentioned in the chapter and of any analysis of their character. Think of what might be the central truth of the book and be make notes on its contents—the history, geography, culture, science, people, events, and topics covered. Outline and chart the key events and themes. Use Bible reference books to increase your understanding of the Word. The Verse-by-Verse Analysis Method: Select one passage of Scripture and examine it in detail. Write out a personal paraphrase, list some questions and observations, find cross-references, record any insights, and write down a brief personal application for each verse. The Thematic Method: Select a Bible theme to study. Then think of three to five questions you'd like to have answered about that theme. Next, study all the references you can find on your theme and record the answers to your questions. Think of topics such as: What should we strive for as Christians? What traits of a fool are given in this book or chapter? Are you looking to go deeper in your faith by studying God's Word with power and passion? You may have heard of this popular acronym for the Bible: B-Basic I-Instructions B-Before L-Leaving E-Earth Not only is the Word was God. He word was God. He was with God in the beginning. The Greek meaning of the word "Word" in this passage is logos, which means speech. It is described as a word, uttered by a living voice, by the sayings of God. With the right Bible study tools and resources, we can study the Bible in ways that give us deeper spiritual insight, knowledge, and wisdom. So how can we begin to understand the Bible better? Pray for Understanding It's always a great idea to start with prayer. Before diving into the Scriptures, ask God to speak to your heart. Ask him to illuminate your mind and deepen your understanding of who he is. We can pray the same prayer that Paul prayed for the Ephesian church: I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. Ephesians 1:17-19b Write Down Words and Phrases you Don't Understand Did you know that it is perfectly okay to write and highlight in your Bible? As you read through the Scriptures, pause to highlight, circle, or underline words, and be sure to look them up in a Bible dictionary. Write down those definitions in your notebook as you read. I first became aware of this method years ago. Our church did a women's Bible study using Kay Arthur's Precepts Bible study materials, and it radically transformed the Bible. Inductive Bible study helps me to understand the Bible study techniques: observation, interpretation, and application. Observation The inductive Bible study method is not merely reading the Bible once and then putting it down. It requires careful observation of the passage was intended for those readers? When studying the Bible, we can write down our observations, the next step in the inductive Bible study method is interpretation. Interpretation is just a fancy word for understanding. In this step we can ask questions like, What does this passage mean? What was the author trying to communicate through the Holy Spirit's leading? Our interpretation of the Bible is very important, because we want to use what we have observed in the passage to guide our interpretation. Application is where we can use our understanding of the Bible and apply its meaning to our daily lives. When we seek to apply the Bible to our lives we can ask questions like, What does this passage mean for me today? How can something that was written in, we can get a better understanding of what that passage means to us today. 2. The SOAP Bible Study Method The SOAP Bible study method. It uses the acronym SOAP to help us better understand the steps involved in this study process. The acronym stands for: S-Scripture O-Observation A-Application P-Prayer The "S" stands for Scripture, and this is where you choose your Bible passage you want to study. You can choose an entire chapter in the Bible, or read through only a few verses if you want to. Once you have chosen your Scripture, you can read the passage and write down the key Bible verses you are going to study. The "O" is for observation, which is very similar to the inductive Bible study method. Write down some of the key observations that you notice from the passage, and be sure to look up any words or phrases that you don't understand. The "A" stands for application. Once again, we want to make sure that we apply Scripture to our lives and our situations. How does the Bible passage we are studying encourage us to live in ways that are glorifying to God? In what ways does that Scripture inspire us to follow God with all of our hearts? That is the beauty of applying God's word to our lives, and how Scripture can truly come alive! The final step in the SOAP method is the "P", which stands for prayer. I love this step because we should not only begin our time in the Word with prayer, but we should end our Bible study time with prayer as well. What new biblical insights did God reveal to you? How can you pray and ask God to continue to help you to apply God's Word to your life? This is where you can praise God for the power and beauty of his Word. Through prayer, you can ask God to continue work in your hearts and in your life. 3. The SOAK Bible Study Method Courtney from Women Living Well uses the SOAK method, but the acronym reads: S-Scripture O-Observation A-Application K-Kneeling in prayer She has a great Bible highlighting colorcoding guide that you can use in your Bible study time as you soak in the Word of God! 4. Priscilla Shirer's 5 P's Bible Study Method I absolutely love anything published and produced by Priscilla Shirer's 5 P's of Bible study that she uses and teaches throughout the book. The 5 P's are: Position yourself to hear from GodPore over the passage and paraphrase the major pointsPull out the spiritual principlesPose the questionPlan obedience and pin down a date Okay, there technically are 7 P's that she discusses in this method! I like this Bible study method because the steps are very specific and practical. In order to position ourselves to hear from God, we can start with prayer and open our hearts to hear what God will speak to us through his Word. The second step (pore over the passage) is reading through the passage) is reading through the passage. I like how she encourages us to paraphrase the passage into our own words to make sure we understand what we are reading. When we pull out the spiritual principles, we can use our observations of the passage to discover the key biblical truths. The last two steps-pose a question and plan obedience get into the interpretation and application of the passage. Questions we can ask ourselves are questions related to the passage that will give us more clarity and understanding of the passage. When we plan obedience, we can then apply the Scripture to our lives and make sure that we are doers of the Word and not just hearers! Pin down a date is where she invites us to write down a date of when we will begin implementing what we have learned, and if possible, find a prayer partner to hold us accountable to apply what we have studied! 5. The APPLE Bible Study Method Arabah Joy introduces us to the APPLE Bible Study Method. The acronym for APPLE stands for: A- Attributes of God P- Promises P- Principles for Living L- Lesson Learned (or sin to avoid) E- Example to follow I like the APPLE Bible study method because I love studying the attributes of God! When reading a Bible passage, it's a good idea to find the attributes of God that are mentioned in the passage. Do we see God as being faithful to his people? How is his splendor and holiness displayed? Do we see examples of his goodness? These are all great questions to consider as we read through the Bible. The Bible will always point us to who God is! Studying God's Promises-I also love studying the promises of God. When we study the Bible, the APPLE method encourages us to make note of any promises that God has made to his people. Whether we are reading through the Old Testament or studying a passage in the Gospels, we can take note of the promises God has made to his people, and ultimately to us. The Word Study Method I really enjoy using the Word Study Method because I definitely consider myself to be a word nerd! I studied foreign languages and linguistics in college, and I always find it fascinating to study Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic, which are the languages the Bible was originally written in. When you do a Word study, you can take a passage of Scripture and highlight a passage you want to further understand. You can then look up the original Greek or Hebrew meaning of a word in that passage to gain a better understanding of what that word means. I have found that studying different words in Scripture makes the Bible come alive even more, and it gives me greater richness to the meaning of the entire passage.
